Harry was a policeman in the Metropolitan Police stationed at Poplar where 3 of his children were born. In 1917 he then took over and kept The Oak Inn, Tiptree for almost 30 years and was a giant of a man 6ft 5ins tall weighing 22 stone. Sadly, Harry only lived 5 years longer than his father and died 1945 aged 63.
