A Tiptree Warhorse? The granddaughter of Ernest G Ager says:

I have also recently been researching Fred Goody who was married to one of Richards sisters. Mum always said he was in ww1, he survived and Mum remembers his horse Ginger which served with him, and somehow returned with him living for many more years. I don't have any pictures of the horse but mum remembers he had his army number marked on him. Having seen 'warhorse' this story intrigues me.

Frederick Harry Goody married Eva May Ager in 1920, their deaths are both registered in Colchester, Frederick in December 1970 and Eva in December 1977.
