The Regiment raised 22 Battalions in total during the course of World War I and saw action on the Western Front, Macedonia and Italy, winning 60 battle honours including 7 Victoria Crosses. The regiment lost 12,840 men who were killed during the course of the war.

8th (Service) Battalion 21.08.1914 Formed in Winchester as part of the First New Army (K1) then moved to Aldershot to join the 41st Brigade of the 14th Division. Nov 1914 Moved to Hindhead then Bordon and back to Aldershot. May 1915 Mobilised for war and landed at Boulogne and ended in various actions on the Western Front including; During 1915 The Action of Hooge, The Second Attack on Bellewaarde. During 1916 The Battle of Delville Wood, The Battle of Flers-Courcelette. During 1917 The German retreat to the Hindenburg Line, The First and Third Battles of the Scarpe, The Battle of Langemark, The First and Second Battles of Passchendaele. 27.04.1918 Reduced to training cadre. 16.06.1918 Transferred to the 34th Division 03.08.1918 Disbanded in France, Desvres.
